



## Composite Decking Maintenance Sheet

Composite decking requires minimal maintenance compared to wood, but periodic care is still important to ensure its longevity and appearance. We recommend cleaning every six months or as needed to keep your decking looking its best and to prevent any potential damage. Below is our recommended process for maintaining your composite decking in optimal condition.



### Step 01

Clear the area by removing all furniture and plant pots to allow access to the full decking area.



### Step 02

Using a soft bristle brush, clear away any loose vegetation and debris.



### Step 03

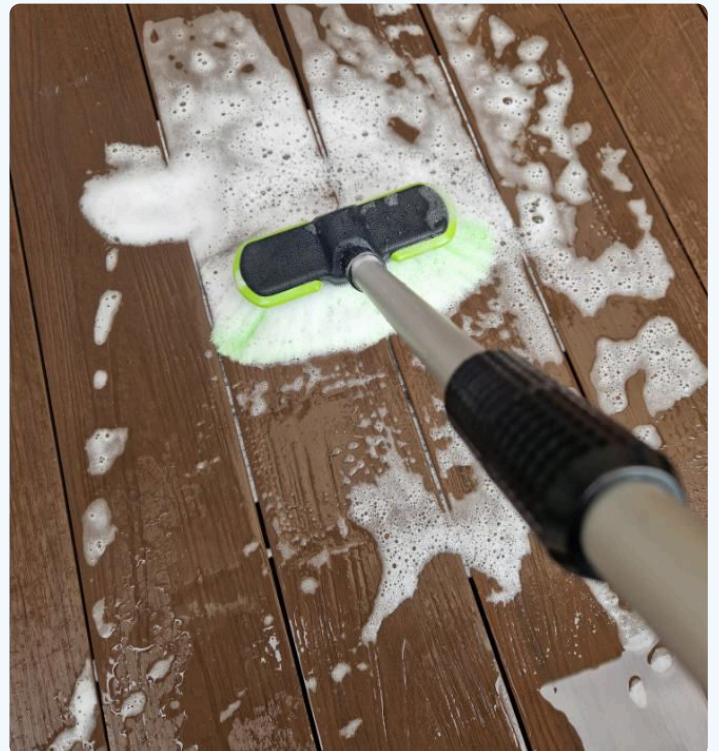
Use a hose to first rinse any loose surface dirt from the decking area. This step is important: it prevents grit from scratching the decking during the main cleaning. Once rinsed, fill a bucket with warm water and dilute it with ammonia free dish soap



### Step 04

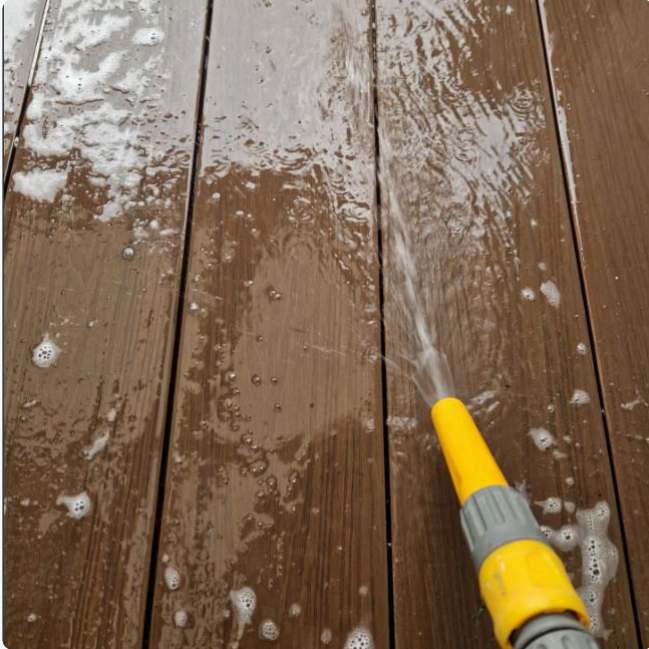
Using your soft-bristled brush and the diluted dish soap solution, scrub the decking until all dirt has been removed.

**Expert Tip:** Do not scrub vigorously! Excessive force can damage and discolor your decking.



### Step 05

Clear all remaining soap using a hose. Allow your decking to dry. If any area of your composite decking is pooling with water, you should investigate the installation, water should freely run off the surface and pooling should not occur



### • Removing tougher stains

For tougher stains, we recommend using a composite cleaner such as Compo-clean as this will remove some of the harder to clean stains without compromising the colour and quality of your project.



### Important: Please Note

- We do not recommend using a jet wash on your composite decking
- Never use harsh chemicals or bleach on your composite decking
- If you have furniture on your decking, we recommend having felt or rubber pads on the feet of the furniture to prevent scratching any potential scratches occurring.
- When using a soft bristled brush, take care not to scrub too hard as this could lead to potential damage to your decking
